

H - World Photography Day and World Humanitarian Day



H - Red Dot Session

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
Understanding AI in Education

As part of the KHAS (Knowledge, Humanistic, Application, and Skill) series, on 24th August, 2024 MES's Pillai College of Education and Research, Chembur, hosted a session on "Understanding Artificial Intelligence in Education," by Mr. Tanmay Mangesh Tawre. Mr. Tawre explained the concept of Artificial Intelligence, emphasizing how AI enables machines to replicate human intelligence. He highlighted the concept of Machine Learning (ML), the history and evolution of AI and elaborated on applications of AI that are transforming multiple sectors such as healthcare, Transportation, Retail, Entertainment, etc. Mr. Tawre also showcased some of the current popular AI applications, providing a hands-on demonstration of tools such as ChatGPT, Gemini by Google, PopAI, Slidesgo, Gencraft and ZeroGPT.
